Overview of Legal Services

- Legal Services Corporation (LSC): Promoting equal access to justice and providing highquality civil legal assistance to low-income individuals
- Nationwide non-profit organizations
- Regulations and oversight
- Individual legal aid programs obtain funding through other sources in addition to LSC funding





Legal Aid of the Bluegrass

- Who We Serve: Low-income families with children, the elderly, veterans, survivors of domestic violence, individuals with barriers to employment, and those who lack the basic necessities of life.
- **Our Areas of Practice**: Attorneys practice in areas including family/domestic law, housing, public benefits, and health and safety.

Kentucky Kids Rise Project

- **Our Mission**: Stabilizing families with children impacted by the opioid epidemic by removing legal and social barriers.
- Trauma-informed approach including an in-house social worker.
- Continuity of some services through new grants

Cases and Clients

- **Our Typical Clients**: We often represent grandparents raising grandchildren, fictive kin, and parents who have left dangerous situations. In some circumstances, we represent children, or parents who have a prior history of substance use but have demonstrated a significant period of and dedication to sobriety.
- Our Typical Cases: The majority of the Kids Rise caseload is based in family/domestic law and advanced planning. However, we also practice in areas of public benefits, education, and housing.
